## 25 HEADTEACHER REPORT

Highlights from the term include:

Learning walks throughout the school and seeing all classes enjoying the reading pledge at the same time. New iPads and headphones enabling all children to access and enjoy using Reading Eggs. Y1 children entering school and settling independently every morning"

"The development of teaching methods e.g. questioning, recall strategies etc. Using Shout it Out/Plickers as interactive assessment tools. Developing more opportunities to talk to children across the school in our subject leader roles."

"Seeing the children enjoying and learning through their Jigsaw lessons. The ERP! Both the Hub and the new Sub Hub opened g and seeing the children progressing!"

"Establishing the cooking club in our new #KeyinghamKids Club. Now we are in Autumn 2, we are beginning to be a little more adventurous and receiving such positive feedback from parents is really encouraging"

"Children in Need. The children loved seeing Pudsey Bear and being part of the day's activities. The FS children are engaging positively with the new areas of provision inside the Foundation Stage Unit and it's reflected in their progress across the Prime areas."

"The commitment of the Well-Being Ambassadors and the future plans they have to improve support for all in school."

"Definitely playing sports with other schools and the lunch time sports clubs are a hit! We have had some amazing successes the Year 5/6 football team where won the small school local area heat and went on to play in the regionals at South Hunsley. We also took part in the local area Cross Country at Withernsea with 3 children achieving 1st and 2nd place and subsequently took part in the regional heat at Cottingham High. On a personal note the PE Coordinator course at Sirius Academy was really useful and allowed me to connect with other PE Leaders."

VW: It's a new initiative run by Julia Lovel from Holderness Academy. 20 learners from each primary and 50 from each secondary will attend. There will be workshops and guest speakers and the focus is on diversity & inclusion

Q: (JF) Can you tell us more about the wellbeing ambassadors (WBA)?

VW: They are a group of children who offered to train as WBA. Their job is to develop wellbeing in school for all. The difference between them and the student council is the SC are elected

## Q: (JF) What support is there for the WBA?

## 26 PERFORMANCE DATA REPORT

- KPS in line with national outcomes despite lower-than-average scaled scores
- Last year's attendance data showed higher levels of absence due to Covid. To date this year, KPS is in line with national attendance figures
- On comparing the current Yr6 cohort demographics to their predecessors, some areas are very similar although SEND is significantly different
- Spelling and handwriting remain a focus
- Intervention tracking on Arbor still a priority

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*C*: (VW) The FFT data is difficult to understand if not familiar. IDSR (Inspection Data Summary Report) data is much easier to follow

*C*: (VW) Mike meets with D Waterson regularly and the progress in Yr6 is remarkable *C*: (JF) It's a worry that governors won't fully understand the new reporting of the data. Having a consistent data report helps us track the progress, or lack of, and trends

#### 27 SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT PLAN

- Review of 'The Big Five' to reflect the needs of SEND, improve staff knowledge and increase pupil accountability
- Impact indicators show 75% of staff consistently delivering high levels of quality first teaching, up from 71% in July 2022
- Increases across the board for Year 6 children
- Parent, pupil and staff voice show positive feedback
- Learning walks not done due to absence
- Issues within the SEND provision identified and addressed

#### Q: (JF) What does the amber reflect?

VW: It's the concept of leadership. Some cannot actively identify effectiveness across all subjects. We will be implementing paired learning walks to help with this

Q: (JF) How can we as governors help?

VW: Just keep asking the questions and completing all of your training

C: (JF) There has been a large increase in reading, I commend the school on their hard work Q: (JF) DA for Yr2 is down?

VW: there was no prior assessment. They have to reach all of the framework targets or will be marked down

## 28 PUPIL PREMIUM STRATEGY UPDATE

Intended outcomes for December 2022:

4	Pupil voice led by subject leaders show that PPG pupils are benefitting from an equally balanced curriculum as all peers. PPG pupils are represented in all Pupil Leadership groups and attend #KeyinghamKids club either through choice or are supported through the school to access this service.

#### 29 INCLUSION UPDATE

#### 29.1 Safeguarding Update

- 4 children currently in a category of concern
- 2 LAC on roll
- 9 children on the safeguarding monitoring list
- 50 safeguarding concerns logged
- 2 children referred to Early Help
- EYFS 1 recording highest attendance with 95.73%, Yr2 lowest with 94.01%
- PA highest in Yr 2 at 29.17%
- Mental health remains a cause for concern with increased numbers accessing MIND
- Vigilance remains high with 100% staff participation for ongoing CPD

## Q: (JF) PA is still quite high, why is this?

VW: We are still seeing lots of term time holidays C: (MC) Strategies are also in place to help some families

Q: (JF) Are there any other factors we need to be aware of?

MC: A few have the odd day off but nothing significant

C: (VW) We also have a very pro-active EWO (Education Welfare Officer)

Q: (JF) Can you tell us a bit more about the change in eating habits and mental health?

MC: We noticed an increase in CPOMS logs regarding this and are keeping a close eye on them

## 29.2 ERP Update

- KPS ERP (the 'Hub') has 4 fully funded places with 3 children currently accessing the provision
- ERP is staffed by an Assistant SENDCo and 2 full time TAs
- Sub-Hub created for KS2 children
- Communication and interaction barriers remain the biggest challenge

C: (VW) Our ERP is one of our biggest successes and we are hoping to help more children in the future

#### Q: (JF) What would be an ideal increase?

VW: We could happily take 4 but we need to be mindful not to overdo it at the moment Q: (JF) How do you manage expectations?

VW: We are open and honest from the outset. If we feel we can't take a particular child, we have to be upfront but kind

## 29.3 SEND Update

- 34 children with SEND
- VW completing NASENDCo qualification to cover strategic aspect whilst SENDCo is on maternity leave
- Speech & Language therapist, Inclusion Practitioner and LA SEND workers work with the children when needed

## Q: (JF) Is there an overlap with the ERP & SEND?

VW: Yes. ERP funding allows one SENDCo. We are also tracking the impact of support staff Q: (JF) Does that have a knock-on effect for the rest of the school?

VW: Yes and it is currently benefitting pupils with very specific needs

Q: (JF) How will you ensure you don't get involved in the operational side of SENDCo whilst you are covering the maternity leave?

VW: I don't have an answer for that. We are training up a staff member but if she is ever off, I don't know what we'll do. I won't have a choice and will be happy to help wherever I can
